AR 342/742 QUESTION SET 2 IRON AGE II: Nations and narratives

Read the articles by Herr, Gitin, Uziel, Weitzman, and Yadin. Based upon these readings and information from lectures, answer the following questions. Be careful to interpret the archaeological evidence on its own terms. Your paper should be about 8-10 pages long. Support factual information with full & specific citations. Do NOT WRITE OUT, QUOTE, OR REWORD CITATIONS OR SECTIONS FROM THE ARTICLES, ETC. THAT YOU HAVE READ.

Use the archaeological evidence dating from the Iron II period (10th-7th c. BCE) from <u>Israel</u> (i.e., the northern highland kingdom), <u>Judah</u> (i.e., the southern highland kingdom), and <u>Philistia</u> (the lowland zone of the southern coastal plain and Shephelah) to answer questions 1-4. In every case, be specific, cite findspots, and specify how the evidence relates to your conclusion.

- **1.** ADMINISTRATIVE ORGANIZATION: For each area, identify one site with Iron IIA (10th c. BCE) and one site with Iron IIB or C (9th/8th or 7th c. BCE) occupation. For EACH period and area, briefly describe remains indicative of administrative functions and explain what these remains suggest about the larger region's organization (2 points each = 12 points).
- **2.** SOCIAL CLASS: For each area, describe archaeological evidence for <u>one</u> specific social class during Iron IIB or C (9th-7th c. BCE) and explain what this evidence suggests about class structure (2 points each = 6 points).
- **3.** ECONOMY: For each area, describe <u>one</u> category of archaeological evidence relevant to understanding economic activity during Iron IIB or C (9th-7th c. BCE) and explain what this evidence suggests about inhabitants' subsistance and/or exchange strategies (2 points each = 6 points).
- **4.** CEREMONIAL PRACTICES: For Israelites, Judahites, & Philistines, describe and discuss **two** remains or pieces of evidence <u>EACH</u> that reflect ritual or ceremonial practices during Iron II B or C (2 points each = 12 points).
- **5.** NATIONAL IDENTITY: By the 7th century B.C.E. (Iron IIC), the southern Levant was home to a number of peoples who conceived of themselves as separate ethnic or national groups. Identify **two** such groups, and <u>FOR EACH</u> describe one category or specific piece of evidence that allows us to recognize and identify them as a distinct people (2 points each = 4 points).
