2015 Men's Serues Cup Finalists & Women's F-Division Winners at CSA Team Nationals

In the final two weeks of the season, the Boston University Squash Team reached the finals of both the respective Men and Women's divisions at the CSA Team Championships.

At the Women's championships, BU clinched the F-Division title with three straight wins over Northeastern University, University of Minnesota, and New York University. From this strong performance in BU's first ever appearance in the Women's Team Championships, Katherine Gianni '18 was named the Harrow Sports College Squash Player of the 2015 Women's National Team Championships for the F-Division after completing the tournament undefeated.

The BU Men reached the finals of the Serues Cup at the CSA Men's Team Championships held at Trinity College, following a victory over Bryant University and a comeback semi-final win against top-seeded Northwestern University, with wins from BU's top-five players, # 1 Ben Bunjapamai, #2 Jack Chambers, #3 Joel Lavoie, #4 Allan Chen, and #5 Arthur Hobhouse.

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



The 2014/2015 season is one that will be remembered in the history of Boston University Squash Team.

This program started off the year with an unprecedented turnout at our fall tryouts. With only a handful of roster slots available, approximately 40 people signed up at Splash, the student organization fair held at the beginning of each year. Over half were turned away. When I joined this team four years ago, BU Squash was not exactly a team. Throughout the year, we cycled through a group of about twelve squash players, most having picked up a racquet for the first time in college, struggling to field the mandatory nine players for each match. Somehow, that core group of about seven players, plus a few others, managed to win the Hawthorn Division at the 2012 CSA Team Championships. This was the turning point for this program.

The following year was arguably the most successful for BU, in terms of results. That year we defeated varsity programs, namely our Boston-rival MIT, for the first time and reached a program-high CSA ranking of #31 nationally, amongst both varsity and club programs, and became the #4 club team in the nation. Though we finished the season as runners-up in the 2013 Chaffee Cup, our performance that season, including achieving the highest ranking increase by any team, showed that BU Squash has the ability and potential to compete in the College Squash Association.

Since assuming the team's presidency my sophomore year, I have made it my goal to popularize the name of our team and to offer equal opportunities for all members of our team to compete while remaining competitive within CSA. I believe I have achieved this goal, and it will remain one of my proudest accomplishments of my time in college.

This season our program fielded a separate women's roster at a match for the first time ever. This was crucial in enhancing our name and attracting players. In the past women have struggled to compete in our top-10 as a co-ed team. If we were lucky, one or two would be able to challenge in to the match line-ups. Not only

were we able to give our women the opportunity to play in an official women's match, they grasped this opportunity, going on to clinch their division at the CSA Women's Team Championships. Keeping to our team's high standards, the men were also able to reach the finals of the Serues Cup at the Men's Team Championships.

In enhancing our team's image and alumni relations, we have boosted our social media presence with both Facebook ([BUSquash](#)) and Instagram accounts ([@bu_squash](#)) in addition to our team [website](#). This is also the second consecutive year where we have hired an alumnus as coach. Succeeding Brian Donovan '11, Jacob Roscoe '14, my former co-captain and former team President, took on the role this year.

As I pass off the presidency to Joel Lavoie '18, and captaincies to Lavoie, Allan Chen '16, Lily Wacker '16, and Chandler Burke '16, I trust that I have left the team in the best hands to lead this team forward. In the past four years we have grown tremendously, competing at a significantly higher level, but also developing the discipline and camaraderie, that will ensure that this team continues to grow and improve with every passing day.





The Boston University Squash Team is coming off successful seasons for both men and women. After a dramatic 5-4 win over Northwestern University at the national team championships, the BU men fell to rival Boston College becoming runners-up for the Serues Cup. The women were able to win all three of their matches at their national team championships. They became champions of the F division in their first year competing as a full women's ladder.

Next season, the men will return six of this year's top nine players. After finishing near the top of the Serues division, we hope to move up a division and return to compete for the Chaffee cup next year. The women, in only their second full year, the team will benefit immensely from playing a full-length schedule for the first time next year. They will return all of this season's top nine players and it will be exciting to see how high the women can climb up the rankings.

With both men and women playing full schedules and attending the national team championships again next year, fundraising will become a major focus next season. We hope to use Agganis Arena clean-ups and other fundraisers to raise money so that our men and women can travel and play full schedules.
