- Provides U.S. and internationally trained lawyers with fundamental exposure to the core topics of international business practice;
- Offers a flexible schedule, ideal for professionals whose work commitments preclude them from attending a traditional nine-month residential program;
- Features a unique blended-learning format, combining two-week residency sessions in Boston and/or Budapest with pre- and post-residency internet-based instruction;
- Is taught by BU Law's regular teaching faculty, consistently ranked among America's best;
- Confers the same internationally recognized LL.M. degree as is awarded to full-time residential students;
- Offers a concentration in international tax, which may be completed entirely online;
- Accepts applications from experienced business executives who seek legal knowledge related to their company's global activities.

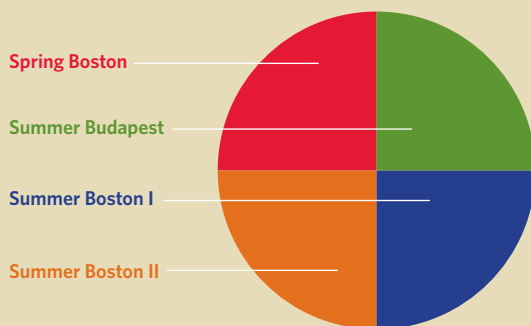

During each residency session, students also participate in two one-credit "Business Law Colloquia." These workshops cover current legal topics in such fields as bankruptcy, intellectual property, alternative dispute resolution, international business arbitration, multijurisdictional practice and competition (antitrust) law.

Concentration in International Taxation (Online)

Executive LL.M. students interested in pursuing a concentration in international taxation may enroll in graduate level tax classes offered online through BU Law's renowned Graduate Tax Program (GTP). These courses are taught by the GTP's regular faculty: scholar-teachers who are members of BU Law's full-time faculty and accomplished tax practitioners. Students who complete the online concentration in international taxation may fulfill the Executive LL.M. degree requirements by attending only two residency sessions, in Boston and/or Budapest.

A FLEXIBLE PROGRAM SCHEDULE

Flexibility is the hallmark of the Executive LL.M. program. Students may choose to attend their two-week residency sessions in Boston and/or Budapest – among the world's most attractive cities. They may begin the program at any of four times: mid-March ("Spring Boston"), June ("Summer Budapest"), mid-July ("Summer Boston I") and late July to early August ("Summer Boston II"). And they may complete three consecutive residential sessions in a single six-week period, or take up to four years to earn the degree. This flexibility enables busy professionals to obtain the LL.M. degree while maintaining their practices and other professional and personal commitments.

AMERICA'S TOP-RANKED TEACHING FACULTY

BU Law has long enjoyed a reputation as one of the most outstanding and engaging teaching faculties in the country. The school is ranked #1 in the nation for "Best Professors" and #6 in the nation for "Best Classroom Experience," according to *The Princeton Review*. In specialized fields, BU Law ranks #8 in the nation in intellectual property law studies, #5 in health law and #5 in tax among U.S. law schools that offer an LL.M. in taxation. BU Law faculty members are preeminent scholars and passionate teachers, committed to student success, inside and outside of the classroom. Executive LL.M. students experience this excellence no matter the setting, whether face-to-face or online.

STATE-OF-THE-ART DESIGN

Each "live" Boston- or Budapest-based class is preceded by six weeks of pre-arrival interactive, internet-based learning and followed by five weeks of online instruction specifically designed to build upon and enhance the classroom experience. Using Boston University's state-of-the-art, award-winning distance technology, students will engage in faculty-supervised problem-solving assignments and exercises, and thus develop the competencies needed to address and resolve the real-world problems they will likely encounter in their transnational practices.

PRE-ARRANGED ACCOMMODATIONS AND EXECUTIVE-STYLE CONVENIENCES

Students in the program enjoy several important conveniences, including pre-arranged housing (included in tuition) in Boston and Budapest for the duration of their residential studies. Also, on days when the colloquium is held during each residential session, students attend school-provided workshop luncheons, in which they interact and network with fellow global practitioners, thus expanding their worldwide connections.

TUITION AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Tuition is set at \$2,164 per credit for the 2012-2013 academic year, which includes housing in Boston and/or Budapest during the residential sessions as well as luncheon workshops. Financial assistance or partial tuition waivers are not available.



ADMISSIONS QUALIFICATIONS

Eligible candidates will generally hold a first degree in law and will demonstrate a high level of English proficiency, as measured by a minimum score of 100 on the TOEFL test. Priority will be given to candidates with notable professional experience and accomplishments. Highly qualified applicants without law degrees may be considered for admission.
